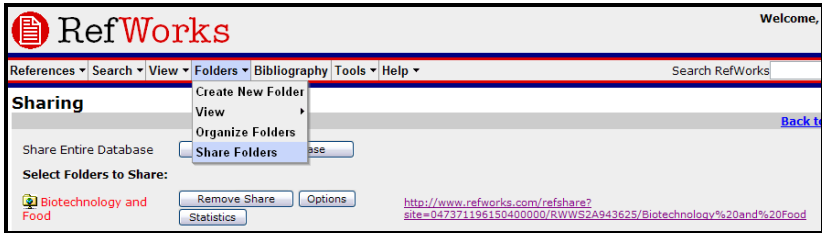


Posting Digital Reading Lists

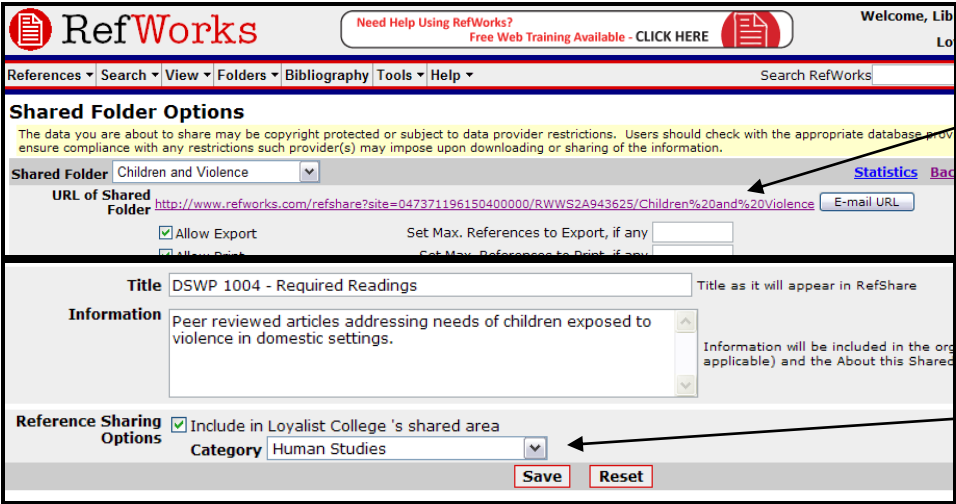
Consider the benefits of posting one comprehensive reading list that will lead students and colleagues to full-text articles from the library’s online journal databases, in-depth print and AV resources, and valuable course related websites.

Bibliographic citations stored in any of your **RefWorks** folders can be shared among students and colleagues in three different ways:

1. Share a **RefWorks** folder via e-mail:
 - Create a folder in **RefWorks** and put the material you want to share in one folder.



- From the toolbar, go to “folders” > “share folders.” Select the “options” button to assign share properties and to email a link to students/colleagues.
2. Post a link to your **RefWorks** folder on Loyalist College’s **RefShare** page, or post a link in your course on Blackboard:



Post this link to Blackboard

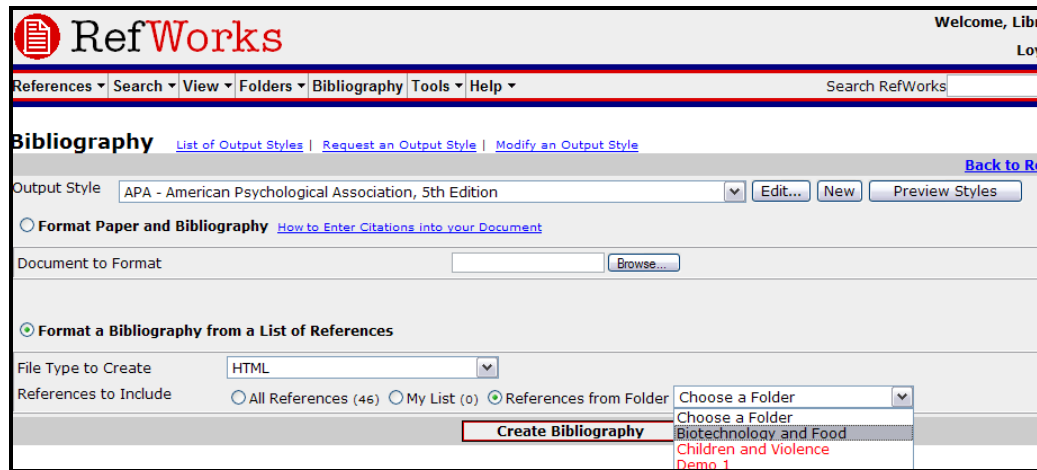
OR

Enable sharing options on RefShare

- **RefShare** folders are available for all schools at Loyalist College.
- Users must be registered to view the Loyalist College **RefShare** screen.
- Non-registered users can be emailed a link to your Refshare folder
 - You control the type of access.

3. Use **Refworks** to prepare a reading/resource list in HTML format. Post the list to your course in Blackboard.

- From your **RefWorks** folder create a bibliography – you choose the citation style.



- Save in HTML format & edit to add specific instructional messages for your students.
